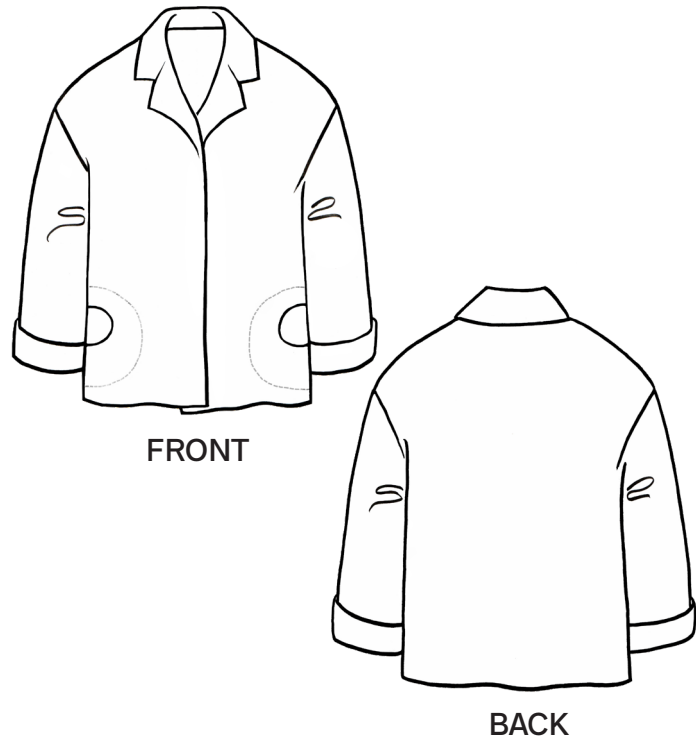


URSULA JACKET HACK



A 'waterfall' style cardigan jacket can be made using the Ursula coat pattern but with a few simple adjustments. Still with the feature rounded pockets, the short jacket has a reverse collar instead of a faced round neck edge, a loose flowing, open front with no fastenings and turn back cuffs, transforming it into a completely different look.

This 'hack' version is specially designed for boiled wool fabric or double-sided fabric that does not fray at the raw edge. There are no hemmed edges which are left raw – a unique characteristic of boiled wool, enabling edges to be left unfinished.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

The Ursula Hack requires an extra 20cm of fabric (Short jacket version).

CUTTING GUIDE:

Cut out all the pieces on the cutting guide **EXCEPT** pieces (4) and (5) (i.e. the Front and Back Neck Facings). You will need:

FRONT (1) – cut two pieces (cut along the 'short length' line for your size or required length).

SLEEVE (3) – cut two pieces (one pair).

POCKET (6) and **POCKET LINING (7)** – cut two pieces of each (two pairs).

BACK (2) – cut one piece with the template lined up to the fold (cut along the short length line for your size or required length).

BACK BELT (8) (optional) – cut one piece.

From the URSULA HACK templates you will need:

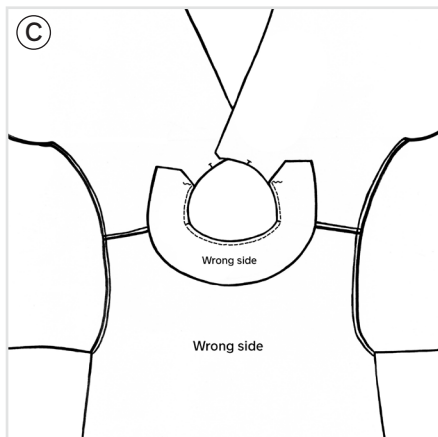
BACK NECK COLLAR ADD-ON PIECE (9) – cut one.

CUFF ADD-ON PIECE (10) – cut two pieces.

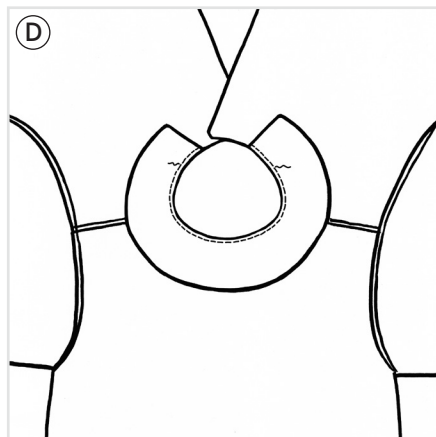
Notch the pieces as indicated on the template.

INSTRUCTIONS:

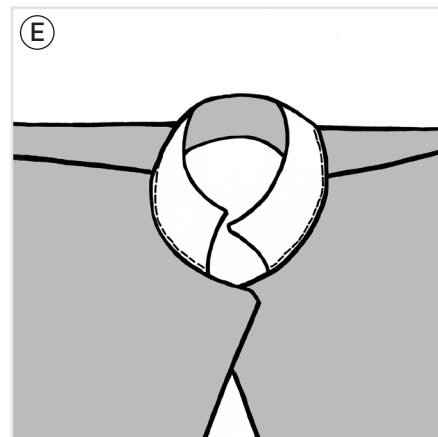
- (A) Follow the pattern from 'JOINING THE SHOULDER SEAMS' Stages 1 to 8. Staystitch around the back neck only.
- (B) Continue at SLEEVES stages 16 and 18 only (do not hem the sleeve edges).



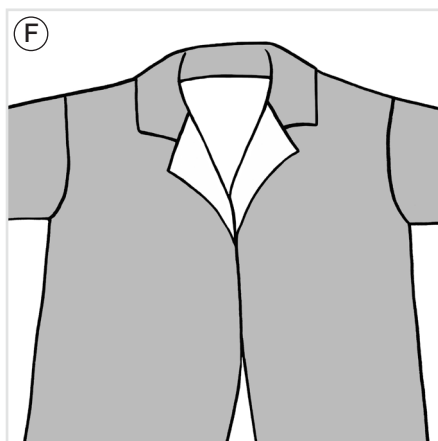
Pin the **BACK NECK COLLAR** add-on (piece 9) **RIGHT SIDE** to the **WRONG SIDE** of the Back neck edge. Align the shoulder seams with the notches each side.



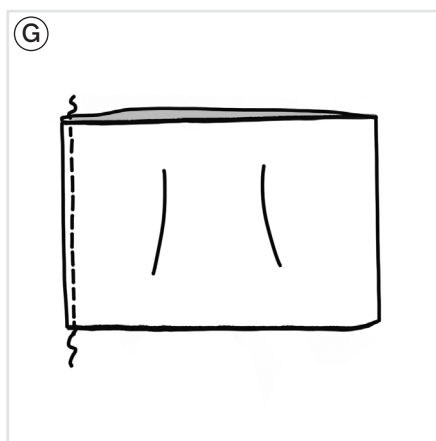
Pin the collar far slanted edges to the curved section of the Front neck edge marked by the second notch. Hand tack. Sew a 5mm (1/4") seam allowance.



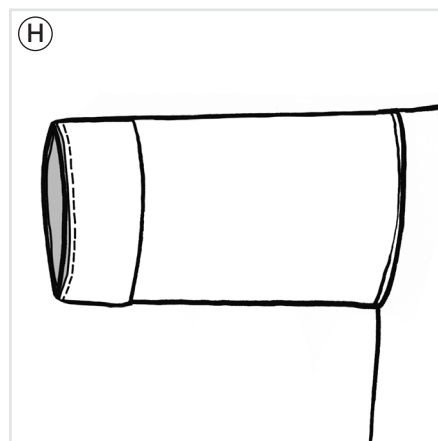
Press the collar upwards and topstitch on the collar right side. Remove the tacking stitches.



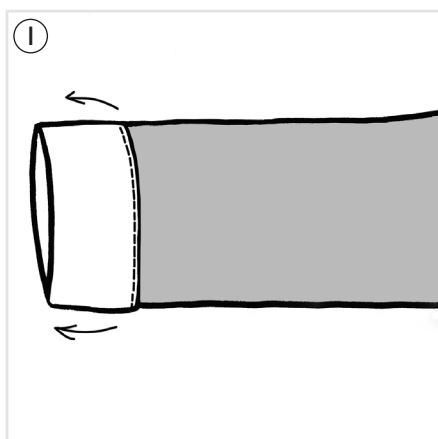
With the right side outermost, fold back to create the reverse collar. Steam press.



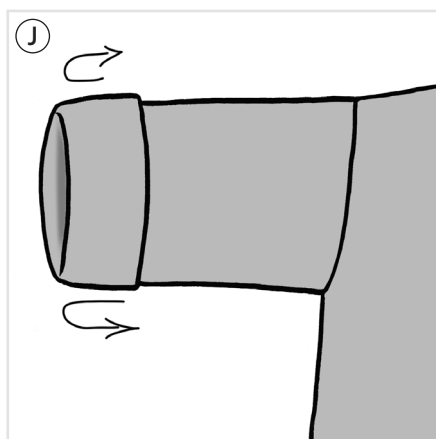
With the right sides together, fold the **CUFF** piece in half aligning the short raw edges. Pin. Sew. Press the seam allowance open on the reverse side. Topstitch either side of the seam right side. Repeat with the other **CUFF** piece.



Pin one **CUFF** add-on (piece 10) **right side** to the to the Sleeve raw edge **wrong side**, aligning the seams. Sew.



Press the seam allowance towards the Cuff on the reverse side. Topstitch on the right side.



Fold back the Cuffs 7cm (2 3/4") approx. so that the seam is covered on the right side. Make a few stitches by hand along the side seam to secure the fold back Cuff in position.



There you have one fabulous Ursula hack jacket.
